As planners, we are required to identify and consult the public for a variety of reasons – statutory requirements of the *Planning Act* or *Environmental Assessment Act*, municipal norms and practices, and stakeholder pressure to be involved in decision-making. Drafting notices and holding public information centres have become commonplace on a planner's to-do list.

Just meeting the minimum requirements often isn't good enough to make informed recommendations in the public interest. Hearing the same old messages from the same few people doesn't sit well. Read more here ...
